Balcones Texas Pot Still bourbon infused with Madagascar vanilla beans, dried cherries, shaved orange peel, Angostura + orange bitters 18

BALCONES FLIGHT | 34

Balcones Texas Pot Still Bourbon, 92 Proof

Flavors of cocoa, vanilla, chalk, orange peels, popcorn, cinnamon, maple icing, and a hint of nutmeg, along with wood and herbal notes.

Balcones Baby Blue, 92 Proof

First, candy corn sweetness meets a note of fire-roasted sweet corn. Past that, the corn husk that is present in very nearly all corn whiskeys is there. The banana, baking spice and vanilla from the nose, with a spicy sweet finish.

Balcones Lineage Single Malt, 94 Proof

A strong oak front with a hint of citrus. Notes of cane sugar, a bit of cinnamon, and baking spices such as clove and nutmeg. Buttery mouthfeel and finishes with a quick bite of black pepper on the end.

LAWS WHISKEY FLIGHT | 39

Laws Whiskey House, Four Grain Bourbon, 100 Proof

Crafted from all four of the American mother grains: corn, wheat, barley, and rye. Difficult to make, and rare. Vanilla and caramel notes from the newly charred, American white oak barrels.

Laws Whiskey House, San Luis Valley Straight Rye, 100 Proof

Made from semi-wild rye grain grown 7,500 feet above sea level. Black tea, sweet mint, salted toffee, orange peel, and stewed fig on the palate. Finishing with peppercorn spice.

Laws Whiskey House, Intention Straight Bourbon, 118 Proof

Made from selected barrels from 3 to 10 years old at cask strength. Buttery pastry, cinnamon, and black tea on the palate. The body is medium in feel and has a bright, lingering finish.

History of Bourbon

Bourbon, an American whiskey, has a rich history dating back to the arrival of European settlers in the 15th and 16th centuries. Rum initially dominated the spirits market in North America, but demand for whiskey grew and led to the Whiskey Rebellion in 1794. The name "Bourbon" originated from a French gesture of gratitude during the American Revolution. Prohibition from 1919 to 1933 severely affected the whiskey industry, but it recovered and became a popular drink with a diverse selection. Today, bourbon remains a popular choice among whiskey enthusiasts.

National Bourbon Heritage Month is an observance in the United States that calls for celebration of bourbon as America's "Native Spirit" during the month of September. On August 2, 2007, the U.S. Senate declared September 2007 as "National Bourbon Heritage Month." The bill, sponsored by Republican Senator Jim Bunning of Kentucky, passed by unanimous consent. The resolution calls for consumers who enjoy bourbon to do so responsibly and in moderation. The bill reinforces the 1964 concurrent resolution of Congress that recognized bourbon whiskey as a distinctive product of the United States.
